



PRAYER FOR ST ALBAN'S

Almighty and everliving God, ruler of all things in heaven and earth, hear our prayers for this parish family. Strengthen the faithful, arouse the careless, and restore the penitent. Grant us all things necessary for our common life, and bring us all to be of one heart and mind within your holy Church; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Every year about this time Episcopalians gather to hear reports on how their faith community has done in the past year and where their community is going in the New Year. Those various reports for 2012 for this faith community are contained within this Annual Report. Please read them all, they will give you a better picture of just who St Albans is, where it has been and where it is going.

Although I have only been part of St. Albans these past sixth months I am happy to be able to announce that in spite of your transition, good things continue to take place in this part of Christ's Kingdom.

Although a community without a "called" and full time Rector can see several things happening that impact that community's present and future. First the Average Sunday Attendance, the ASA, can drop off as some members disappear ¬and parish growth be stymied. St Albans' ASA for 2012 was 172 compared to 2011's ASA of 178.

Income is also effected during transition and this shows with our 2013 income projected at \$400,125.00 which is somewhat less than what we received in 2012.

Obviously programs that the previous clergy led and had a passion for can suffer and programs in general may struggle. In other words, this "in between time" can really be a bummer!

But also this "in between time" can be a real blessing as new things can and will happen.

For an example, without a full time priest – will lay people step forward and begin exercising their own Baptismal gifted ministry and get the task done?

- What are the holes in the life of St Alban's right now as you see it?
- Do those holes require an ordained person to make them happen?
- Do they require priestly training to make them so, or can a lay person with a passion make it so?

When a congregation sees it's pastor as the chief and only minister in that community, the members of that community are failing to live up to his or her own Baptism Covenant.

- If you have a passion for ministering to children, we can help you make that so!
- If you have a passion for ministering to the sick and the shut in, we can help you make that so!
- If you think we need a program for middle and high schoolers, we can help you make that so!
- If you have a passion for adult education, we can help you make that so!

All the church has ever needed for successful ministry is lay people with a passion to make a difference in the life of others and who do!

Do You Have Such A Passion?

On the other hand if your passion has grown cold, your interest waivered or if complacency has gripped your heart, then St Albans is in real trouble.

The size of a faith community also dictates how the pastor is able to function as a leader and that is no less true with St Albans. Your former Rector did a wonderful job here, but his success was limited by the size of the parish and the limitation that size puts on a single priest. (The same is true for me and for your next priest as well.)

If you would ask Bishop Jeff Fisher if there were programs, ministries or outreach that he wish he had been able to accomplish at St Alban's I am sure he would say yes. Like all Rectors he probably has a laundry list of exciting and wonderful things he was not able to accomplish here.

The truth is that success in ministry is measured by and through the things

that we accomplished including members personal spiritual growth which is hard to measure.

Your former Rector, from my perspective accomplished several amazing things including, reconciliation, unification and growth; any of which is a full time job requiring amazing gifts, talents, courage and time – lots of time, patience and a sense of humor.

But there is still more to do if you are to build upon his hard work as well as the hard work of all those who came before him; lay and clergy, the living and the dead.

So if you see something that needs to be done at St Albans, maybe you are seeing it because God is calling you to do it!!!

My job here at St. Albans as a "part-timer" is to keep the positive things going and provide in the 3½ days a week that I am in Waco as much Liturgical, Homiletical, Administrative, and Pastoral ministries as I can.

Sadly as Paul says of himself I have to add my own "amen" to; "the good that I want to do I cannot..." because of my travel from Lewisville to Waco plus the preparation required for three Sunday's Liturgies, my Adult Class, the Sunday's Bulletin and managing the office and staff requires almost 3 days.

One half of a day doesn't provide much time for creating new ministries or the pastoral work that pops up. The reality of it all is that you not only need a full time Rector your new Rector will need an assistant priest -- ASAP.

But having said this I want to add how much I am enjoying being with you and ministering here in Waco. Both Parish and community have much to offer a clergy family and I am looking forward to my remaining months here as well.

I am so very appreciative of the wonderful work that Howard Thompson, David Gilbreath, Megan Stewart and Mary Ann Thompson do for us on Sundays and other worship occasions; the support and leadership of the St Alban's Church Staff, Karen Tanner, Janet McKelvy, Rebecca Hughes, Elaine Karban and Gabino Sanchez and of course the many volunteers that make this place go.

Please know that you are in my prayers and will be for years to come. May God bless you and me as we try to do our best in his service. I urge you to

be diligent in your prayers for me, your Vestry, the search committee, your new rector and all those who make up St Alban's.

Senior Warden's Report Jim Sartwelle

Junior Warden's Report Stewart Kelly

The primary responsibility of the Junior Warden is to oversee the operations of the physical campus facility of St. Albans Episcopal Church. Fortunately, this past year, from a budget vs actual perspective, we did well. Basically we came in a few thousand dollars under budget for the church and the outreach center. For the second year in a row, this was accomplished primarily by not having any major expenses to the buildings or systems. As was the case in 2011, we were not able to set aside money in the budget to cover any major expenses such as air conditioning systems, roof repair, painting, plumbing, parking lot, etc.

We continued to operate in a "team approach" to the Junior Warden duties which was established in 2011. A few of the vestry members were assigned specific areas of the St. Albans campus to oversee and handle various issues that arose. This team structure seems to work well and distributes the workload.

The Outreach Center continues to serve an important role in our community. Currently our partners are: Central Texas String Academy, Waco Children's Theatre, and Community Race Relation Coalition. We have the capacity to absorb one or two more partners, which we hope to accomplish this year.

We are so blessed to have a wonderful church facility. It is each one of our responsibilities to take ownership. As you are attending church or any of the many gatherings, please take time to look around. This is your church Home. Please look at it that way. If you see something that needs addressing, let a vestry member or the church office know. Or, better yet, volunteer to head up a task force to get it done. As always, a special thanks to the church staff. They do an awesome job and their dedication is exceptional.

Music Department

Howard Thompson, Director of Music: Choirmaster

The music department of St. Alban's Parish had a busy and successful year in 2012. The Chancel Choir provided musical leadership for service music and anthems or solos for all 10:00 am services throughout the year. The choir also participated in special services on Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday, joined with the St. Paul's choir for Good Friday and both services on Easter day. In December the Chancel Choir presented the Christmas portion of "Messiah" by Handel accompanied by students from the Central Texas String Academy. Attendance was over 220 for this event. The annual concert of Christmas music was presented at 10:30 pm on Christmas Eve prior to the 11:00 pm service.

The music program is lead by the Choirmaster, the Organist, Mr. David Gilbreath and our Carillonneurs, Mary Ann and Howard Thompson. The carillon is played before and after the 10:00 am service most weeks. There are also 6 choir scholarship singers who provide great assistance to the choir and the church. Megan Stewart provides the music for the 5:00 pm service on Sundays.

We have a tuner/technician for our organ who does maintenance as well as tuning. We are working with a representative from the Reuter Organ Company, which built our organ, to determine the work which must be done to maintain our fine instrument. After almost 60 years parts of the organ are beginning to fail because of cracking leather pouches under the pipes, which open and close to regulate the air flow to the pipe. This will continue to worsen as the leather pouches age. We have already begun disabling pipes where the pouches have failed. This will continue until parts of the organ are no longer usable. A complete renovation of the organ should put it in good working condition for another 60-70 years. Some cleaning has already been done to the rear gallery organ where some of the worst problems have been. Consideration is also being given to relocating some pipes to improve the aesthetics of the instrument as well as improve the sound in the Sanctuary.

Plans for 2013 include continued service leadership, special services and a major work with orchestra next Advent season.

EPISCOPAL CHURCH WOMEN (ECW)

The Episcopal Church Women is an organization whose membership consists of every woman who is a member of St. Alban's Church.

We are the Women of the Episcopal Church: rooted in our past and growing into God's future. We had beautiful flowers delivered to Tyler, Texas for Father Fisher's celebration of being elected Suffragon Bishop of the Diocese of Texas.

ALTAR GUILD

The Altar Guild had another busy year in 2012 making sure the Church sanctuary and related venues were properly set up for the many regular and special services the former Rector, Associate Rector, and Interim Rector conducted for the parish.

There were many challenges in 2012 as a result of the election of Reverend Jeff Fisher as Bishop Sufragon in the East Texas Region of the Texas Diocese, the transfer of Reverend Jimmy Abbott to become the Rector of Holy Com-

forter Church in Spring Texas, and the engagement of the Reverend Canon David Holland as Interim Rector at St. Alban's. Notwithstanding the changes in leadership, the members of the altar guild provided the same high quality of services through the year.

The annual conference for altar guild members from throughout the Texas Diocese was held at Camp Allen in March with approximately 60 representatives from churches throughout the Diocese in attendance, including your altar guild director. The conference was very productive with priests from throughout the Convocation presenting programs to challenge each altar guild in its mission to serve its home church. The information that was shared is always useful because it gives each person in attendance more resources in serving his or her church.

Cathy Ratcliff again honored St. Alban's by making and donating to the Church beautiful hand stitched fairlinens for use in the Easter services. The Church also received new hangings for use in the Christmas services and during Epiphany. We sincerely appreciate and thank the donors for their generous and useful gifts to the Church.

We developed a very helpful new pictorial guide detailing how to prepare the altar for the many different worship services the Parish enjoys.

It is appropriate to acknowledge with thanks Peggy Aston's service to the Church by serving as wedding coordinator for more than 30 years.

Your altar guild director was appointed the delegate for Province VII of the National Altar Guild Association and invited to attend the National Episcopal Convention in Indianapolis Illinois, in July 2012. The experience was most enriching and gave great national exposure to St. Alban's participation in altar guild activities in the Diocese.

We added three new members to the altar guild in 2012 and, as always, extend our thanks to the many continuing members of the altar guild for their silent service to the parish. We always welcome others who care to join this very important group of dedicated individuals.

St. Alban's Endowment Fund

Robert Frahm - Committee Chair

The Endowment Fund did not only have a good year, it had a fabulous year! Thanks to the contributions of generous donors and increases in the market value of the investment portfolio, the Endowment Fund experienced a net increase in market value of 32% for the year. That percentage of increase was after distributions to the Church of approximately 4% of the market value of the Fund at the beginning of the year.

The total amount distributed to the Church in 2012 was \$17,100. Donations received amounted to \$101,645 and earned dividends plus market value increases amounted to \$57,164. This performance represents the kind of activity your Endowment Fund Committee and investment advisor have strived for as stated in the investment policy and by encouraging generous giving.

Accompanying this report is a Statement of Increases and Decreases in the Fund for the year ending December 31, 2012. The Fund continues to be fully invested in publically traded American Fund Mutual Funds.

The Endowment Fund Committee authorized distributions for the benefit of the Parish in 2013 in the amount of \$12,000, to be applied as determined by the Vestry. This represents approximately 3% of the market value of the Fund at the time the distributions for 2013 were authorized.

Members of the Church are encouraged to consider remembering the Endowment Fund when preparing a Will or estate plan, in addition to remembering the Fund when it is appropriate to honor a person or occasion with a charitable contribution. With continued Parish support and a healthy investment return, the Fund will continue to represent a meaningful economic contributor to the mission of the Church.

Thanks to the Committee members for their service in the operations and administration of the Endowment Fund and to Joe Bozarth, the Committee's investment advisor, for his service in overseeing the investment program.
